CREATING A STRONG NETWORK FOR THE VICTIMS, WITNESSES AND THEIR FAMILY.

The Department of Justice and Correctional Services of the Cree Nation Government provides through their CAVAC officers a number of essential services, including referral, technical assistance, advice and information, to victims, witnesses and their family.



ASSISTING VICTIMS THROUGH REFERRALS

CAVAC officers ensure that clientele is referred when necessary to:

- post-trauma and/or psycho-social counselling or intervention
- specialized services such as the appropriate legal, medical, social and community resources.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION

CAVAC officers also give information to the victims, witnesses and their families on crime victims' rights and remedies to which they may be entitled.



OUR CAVAC STAFF

In 2009, the Department of Justice and Correctional Services hired its first of eventually three CAVAC officers to deliver specialized services in Cree to crime victims or witnesses and to their family, regardless of whether the perpetrator of the crime has been identified, arrested, prosecuted, or convicted. The front-line services are free of charge and strictly confidential.
