## IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING COURT

On Monday, July 20, 2020, the Court of Quebec Sessions will resume in the Cree communities as scheduled through video conferencing services connecting with the judge and court personnel outside of the Cree territory.

If you have received a notice to attend court for any reason, you must appear in person. If you have a case or hearing that was delayed because of COVID-19, then you should also check with your lawyer if you are on the court docket.

Due to COVID-19 safety concerns, the following provisions have been made

• Courtroom space allocations to maintain 2-metre distances, and a limited number of people will be allowed in the lobby at a given time.

 Sanitizing stations will be available for your safety.

 Use of videoconferencing for judges and others from outside the community to limit visitors to the communities.

• If you have concerns related to COVID-19, the Bar of Quebec has agreed with the courts to allow lawyers to appear on your behalf at this time. If you do not have a lawyer, the receptionist or CJO at each location can provide you with a list of names to represent you.

Failure to appear before the court when given a summons means that the court may issue a warrant for your arrest.
